HR professionals and leaders,

The only constant is change, and that is especially true in the S1 world. Constantly changing regulations and policies means that even the most seasoned human resources professionals must stay up-to-date with training. Next quarter will introduce new ways to perform S1 functions, and I want administrative personnel to prepare themselves and embrace all the new training.

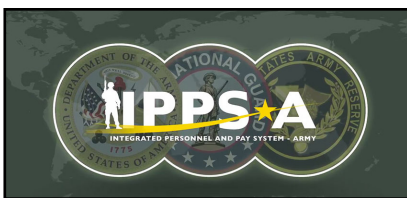


Here is a quick summary of some of the new training human resource professionals will need to complete:

First off, it's important to note that retention is one of the highest priority on every leader's list. The GOCOM is holding its first-ever Retention Management Training in December for all new unit administrators and battalion career counselors. The goal is to ensure that everyone knows the proper administrative process to retain Soldiers. The training will teach techniques on how to approach and engage retention conversations with each of your Soldiers. However, it's just as important to know how to properly process extensions and bonuses as it is to have a conversation about it! Errors in this process can allow Soldiers to be automatically purged from systems or delay bonus payouts, which affects morale and confidence throughout the organization. Let's make sure we get it right the first time.

Next is IPPS-A training. If you're a Soldier that has been identified as someone who has a responsibility or role in IPPS-A, you should've received an email stating that you're enrolled in IPPS-A training.

If you haven't received an email, please let your S1 know so they can correct the error.



The distance learning training is required prior to the in-person training being held in March 2020 at several locations throughout NY. And, while some Soldiers might only be required to complete the online training, others must attend the in-person training. Either way, if you have received the training email, embrace it and get started early!

Unfortunately, the training is not intuitive or quick to complete, especially if you have multiple roles. Human resources professionals should ensure their commanders receive the required training as well, as they're a linchpin to this new program. Most personnel action requests go through them, and if they're not trained and proficient on the new processes, those Soldier's actions sit in the system and don't get processed. So, get your commanders involved now.

Again, the only constant is change. Let's get out there and engaged on all the new developments in the S1 arena!

Brazil leadership pays a visit to New York



Brazilian Lt. Gen. Achilles Furlan Neto, the operations officer for the Brazilian Army, visited with the New York National Guard senior leaders, Soldiers and Airmen and facilities in Latham, Scotia, Camp Smith and New York City Oct. 6-11.

Furlan's visit was part of the training and exchange partnership between the New York National Guard and the Brazilian military under the National Guard's State Partnership Program.

The New York National Guard earlier this year signed a Partnership Declaration between Maj. Gen. Ray Shields, the adjutant general of New York, and Brazilian Navy Rear Adm. Guilherme da Silva Costa, representing the Brazilian National Defense Force, aboard the Intrepid Air & Space Museum.

The goal of the State Partnership Program allows National Guard Soldiers and Airmen to learn from military members of other nations, while also sharing American military expertise with friends and allies.

The State Partnership Program also helps to advance U.S. strategic efforts while engaging in partnerships with friendly militaries worldwide to promote shared security goals.

"We can help achieve security cooperation through long-term personal relationships, and that's what the National Guard's State Partnership Program offers," said Maj. Gen. Ray Shields.



The State Partnership Program has been successfully building those relationships for 25 years and now includes 75 partnerships with 81 nations around the globe. The State Partnership Program links a unique component of the Department of Defense - a state's National Guard - with the armed forces or equivalent of a partner country in a cooperative, mutually beneficial relationship.

The State Partnership Program evolved from a 1991 U.S. European Command decision to set up the Joint Contact Team Program in the Baltic Region with Reserve component Soldiers and Airmen. A subsequent National Guard Bureau proposal paired U.S. states with three nations emerging from the former Soviet Bloc and the State Partnership Program was born, becoming a key U.S. security cooperation tool, facilitating cooperation across all aspects of international civil-military affairs and encouraging people-to-people ties at the state level.



"The State Partnership Program is about people; Soldiers and Airmen meeting with counterparts and peers, sharing lessons, best practices and building those critical long term relationships," Shields said.

Command Logistics Review Team Assessment moved to FY21

On 29 July 2019, the Army National Guard (ARNG) Command Logistics Review Team (CLRT) sent an official memo that moved the New York CLRT assessment to FY 21. The original date was 18-22 November 2019. The ARNG determined that this shift was appropriate as NY has a past track record of favorable CLRT assessments. The new memorandum officially moved the CLRT assessment to 15-19 March 2021. The ARNG CLRT team will provide additional details of the inspection process in a memorandum approximately 100 days prior to their arrival.

In light of this change, we need units to continue targeting their focus on the five main areas: Command Supply Discipline Program, Unit Supply, Property Book Management, Unit Maintenance, and Mobilization Logistics.

When conducting inspections, please ensure all new checklists are being utilized. The new Command Deployment Discipline Program CLRT checklist is on GKO with an effective date of 01 October 2019. Also, the new Command Maintenance Discipline Program checklist will be published at the end of November 2019 and sent out to the field.

Three Changes to Discharge Procedures

Change 1: An issue was determined that unauthorized personnel have received Commander, or Commander's Representative, approval/disapproval workflow in their Business Workplace Inbox.

GCSS-Army maintenance users will experience a change to dispatching procedures on the projected date of 7 December 2019. This upcoming fix will ensure authorized users in the Commander, or Commander's Representative position such as the Executive Officer, receive access to the approval/disapproval workflow. Maintenance managers and supervisors who have been set up as Alternate Workflow Approvers using the "Maintain Equipment Dispatch Approving Authority Delegation" (ZDAPR) process, will have their authorization to Approve Workflow removed during the December release.



Access Administrators will follow HQDA G-46 Army Audit Readiness guidance posted on the GCSS-Army Homepage and the Job Aid: Documentation Requirements for Personnel Substitutions Commander or Authorized Representative Checklist posted in the End User's Manual Plus when transferring authorized personnel into the Commander or Commander's Representative position.

To provide Commanders dispatch approval flexibility, a revised DA Form 5987-E "Equipment Dispatch" will provide a new manual signature block for approval outside of GCSS-Army. Dispatch workflow will now expire at the end of the day (midnight) the dispatch is scheduled to start. Example, dispatch Start Date: 1-November-19 / Start Time: 0600, expires midnight that day. Prior to this change, the dispatch workflow expired within 24 hours of when the dispatch was created. This provides units the ability to stage dispatch approval workflow early in support of the mission.

Approvers will see a new message as they login telling them if they have dispatch workflow that will be expiring in two days if they don't take action.

Dispatchers will start getting the popup message as the approver approves or rejects the dispatch if they are logged in, or the next time they sign into the system. Approvers will get the popup as a dispatch workflow is routed to them for approval if they are logged in, or they will see that message the next time they log in.

Change 2: A secondary issue identified that unauthorized personnel have created Alert Dispatch Notifications for unauthorized equipment.

An upcoming fix will ensure unauthorized users cannot create dispatch notifications on equipment they do not own. Users will not be able to create Alert Dispatch notifications with a starting and/or ending date from the past. Equipment with a status of NODP "No Dispatch" will not have an Alert Dispatch notification created. A revised DA Form 5987-1-E "Alert Dispatch" will provide leaders and supervisors with operator restrictions such as "Daytime Driving Only".

Change 3: A third issue found that users did not have the ability to mass-complete Alert Dispatch notifications when no equipment usage was recorded.

An upcoming change will allow users to mass-complete Alert Dispatch Notifications when no equipment usage was recorded after an alert, or when new Alert Dispatches are being created for equipment that recorded no usage.

SJA Corner

Commonly known as “JAGs,” judge advocates represent the command in various administrative, investigative, and punitive settings where Soldiers are named respondents. While they advise and assist commanders with preserving military morale, good order, and discipline, judge advocates also provide legal assistance to individual Soldiers.

53rd Troop Command Legal Office:

We all know the saying: “Loose Lips, Sink Ships!” But, in today’s social media driven world the things you post online may subject you to NJP, Reduction in Rank or even Separation from the Military.

OPSEC ‘breaks’ when anyone who is related to those members or the members themselves reveal confidential military information that can put people at risk.

My top 6 list of OPSEC don’ts:

1. Don’t “check-in” at drill. Believe it or not, Soldiers have checked-in at drill or annual training on Facebook. No joke. So now everyone knows where you are.

2. Don’t list your military job on Facebook/Linkedin, etc. Do you really want the enemy to know specifically what you do? That information could potentially be used against you.

3. Make sure your spouse/girlfriend/ boyfriend/significant other doesn’t post where you are and what you do. Ask yourself this: could someone with bad intentions who knows my husband is gone (because, I said so on Facebook) use this information to make me think he knows my husband or make my husband think he knows or has been in contact with me? If so, don’t post it.

4. Don’t post duty hours, drill dates, annual training, school info, etc. You may think your Facebook page is private - but do you really know that for sure?

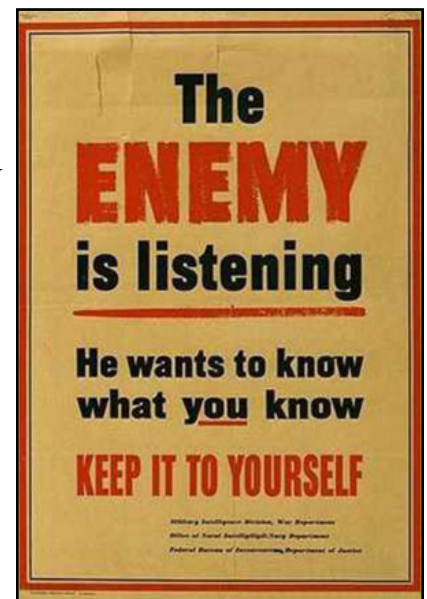
5. Don’t text, instant message, email, post, snap, instagram, tweet, etc any information regarding incidents which occur on a base or at drill. If there is ANY incident (Injury, Arrest, LOD, etc) it is NOT your place to inform anyone - that is handled by the chain of command and chances are you’re not in that chain.

6. Don’t post your metadata. “What is metadata,” you ask? Metadata is that information linked to your photos or status updates letting people know where you posted from.

138th Public Affairs Detachment participates at Saber Junction '19

Joint Multinational Readiness Center, Hohenfels, Germany

The 138th Public Affairs Detachment recently completed a three-week deployment to the Joint Multinational Readiness Center (JMRC) in Hohenfels, Germany where they participated and contributed to the JMRC: Saber Junction 19's public affairs mission while working to develop and expand their own public affairs operations.



The deployment, which took place from Sep. 13th through 30th, which saw the 138th PAD partner with members of the 7th Army Training Command, 173rd Airborne Combat Brigade, and Washington National Guard to complete multiple tasked projects at the JMRC. The units worked together to conduct relevant Mission Essential Task List (METL) training, sustain readiness, and prepare for future mobilization requirements.



The JMRC trains leaders, staffs, and units up to Brigade Combat Teams and multinational partners, to dominate in the conduct of Unified Land Operations anywhere in the world, now and in the future, and provides a myriad of indispensable capabilities to the U.S. Army and our European Allies and partners. The JMRC is situated in the Oberpfalz region of Bavaria and headquartered at USAG Bavaria, Hohenfels Training Area.

"Participating in Saber Junction 19 was vital for providing us an opportunity to train in a different skill set that we don't get anywhere in the U.S., by closely matching the deployment processes and mission execution in a distant theater," said Sgt. Michael Bezares, a Public Affairs NCO for the 138th Public Affairs Detachment.

The 138th PAD produced over 100 photos, 6 videos and 5 stories for public release covering an array of foreign militaries such as Turkey, Italy, Azerbaijan, North Macedonia and Bosnia and Herzegovina. The 138th PAD's products reached different outlets such as the New York Post, AFN Bavaria, Department of Defense, Army.mil, and other Twitter and Facebook pages.
