- 1. JUSTIFICATION: Request that a modification be completed for Appendix 1004 FY 14 to reflect First Quarter Allotment. The allotment for this appendix is all under the 100% Federal Share and will be used to support the ARNG Electronic Security System Installation, Operation and Maintenance Program as outlined with the appendix. In addition, the AFP in Appendix 1004 is increased by \$26,190.00 and decreased in Appendix 1003, ARNG Security Cooperative Agreement by \$26,190.00 as directed by NGB.
- 2. The Estimated Cost (AFP-Federal) for this appendix is increased by \$26,190.00 from \$496,415.00 to \$522,605.00.
- 3. The Maximum Funding Limitation (MFL-Federal) for this Appendix for FY 14 is increased by \$200,000.00 from \$0.00 to \$200,000.00.
- 4. In-Kind Assistance is \$0.

- 7. FY2014 funding for this modification is authorized pursuant to HR2775, as enacted, Section 116.
